➤ Evidence of Success:

- i. Achievements in different fields: A few of them are cited below.
- **Adil Hussain:** Adil Hussain, who has worked in Indian as well as International cinema, is an alumnus of B. Borooah College (Batch 1981-1983). He started acting in plays and performing as a stand-up comedian during his college days.
- **Pramod Chandra Bhattacharyya:** Eminent linguist, folklorist and educationist Dr. Pramod Chandra Bhattacharyya was a student of B. Borooah College. He joined B. Borooah College as a lecturer in the Department of Assamese and became the principal of the college, a position he retained till his retirement. He was credited with pioneering research work on the Bodo language and published works on Bodo language.
- **Jahnu Barua:** Renowned filmmaker Jahnu Barua pursued the Bachelor of Science Degree at B. Borooah College. He achieved international recognition for his Assamese film *Halodhiya Soraiye Baodhan Khai*. 1. Title of the Practice:

PRESERVATION OF COLLEGE HERITAGE

B. Borooah is one of the oldest colleges of Assam. The college preserves its identity and heritage through a variety of measures.

3. The Context:

The birth of the college has a significant historical background. In 1941, the British Government had issued an order barring students, who joined the freedom struggle, from pursuing education at Cotton College, the oldest college of the region. Under these circumstances, there was a move to open an alternative college. The move was temporarily stalled because of World War II in 1942. A year after the war, the college was opened in a temporary campus at Kamrup Academy School where young men fighting against the British during daytime came to pursue studies at night. Evidences of almost everything of the college were reduced to ashes when a devastating fire engulfed it on March 3, 2005. The college was able to revive itself after the incident and re-establish its position more strongly and carry forward its and heritage and legacy.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF B. BOROOAH COLLEGE

B. Borooah College was established in the year 1943 in the name of Bholanath Borooah, considered to be one of the most successful Assamese merchants ever. Bharat Ratna Gopinath Bordoloi, the first Chief Minister of Assam after independence, was the founder principal and the first president of the college governing body. The inception of the college can be traced to the Indian struggle for independence. Till the establishment of Gauhati University in 1948, B. Borooah College was affiliated to Calcutta University

The college is eternally grateful to those great personalities who have rendered invaluable services to the college and the society at large. As a lasting tribute to these great sons of the soil, the college have preserved their books, awards, achievements, besides dedicating college buildings in their names, organising events and programs.

This structure has been named after our first Principal, Gopinath Bordoloi, the first Bharat Ranta of Assam and the entire North East India.

▪ **A brief note on Lokapriya Gopinath Bordoloi**

Bharat Ratna Gopinath Bordoloi, the first Chief Minister of Assam after independence was the founder principal and the first president of the college governing body. Due to his unselfish dedication towards the people, the then Governor of Assam, Jayram Das Doulatram conferred him with the title “Lokpriya” (loved by all). **He was the first from the Northeastern region**

to be the awarded the Bharat Ratna, the highest civilian award of the country. It was his forceful opposition against tagging Assam with East Bengal (Grouping Plan) that has secured the future of the state. He also played a crucial role in rehabilitating millions of Hindu refugees who fled from East Pakistan. He was instrumental in establishing the Gauhati High Court, The Assam Medical College at Dibrugarh among others. His tenure as Chief Minister witnessed all-round development of the state. His was the first government among all the provincial governments in India which dared to levy agriculture income tax on the rich and powerful planters which helped usher in *swaraj* in place of *planters' raj*. He wrote several books which included *Buddhadev*, *Annaskaktiyoga*, *Hajrat Mohammad* and *Shreeramachandra*.

➤ ***Remembering the Contributions of Bholanath Borooah***

B. Borooah College was established in the year 1943 after the name of Bholanath Borooah, considered one of the most successful Assamese merchants ever. A doyen of Assamesebusiness, a great philanthropist and an ardent lover of education, he contributed immensely to its growth and propagation. He donated rupees ten thousand to Calcutta University for the publication of the volumes of ‘*Assamiya Sahityar Chanei*’, rupees one lakh to the Govt. of Assam to establish the Jorhat Technical Institute, which was later renamed as the Prince of Wales Technical School.

In 1943, with the confirmation of the site of the campus of the present B. Borooah College building, his family members graciously came forward to bear the cost of the college building. Accordingly, an agreement was signed between the college authority and the donor, and it was decided to name this educational institution as ‘B. Borooah College’. Thus, the college came into existence from the donation made by Shri Keshab Kanta Barua of Guwahati, in memory of his uncle, the late Bholanath Borooah.

In memory of this great soul, a bust has been installed at the entrance of the college building, along with a debate competition, - **The Bhola Borooah Memorial North East Inter-College Debating Competition.**

A separate and exclusive 'Hem Barua Collection' found in the central library of the college. This rare collection is donated by Hem Barua's family.

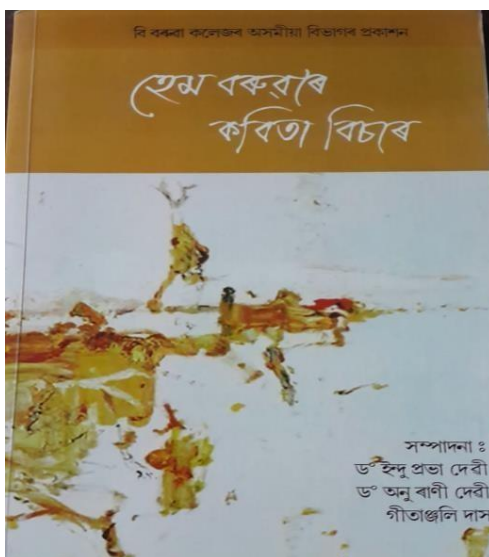

➤ Remembering literary doyens

B. Borooah College takes pride that five of its former faculty members viz., Hem Barua, Jogesh Das, Dr. Nirmal Prabha Bordoloi, Dr. Bhupen Hazarika and Dr. Birendra Nath Dutta,

have served as the President of the Asom Sahitya Sabha, the oldest literary-cultural organization of Assam. The literary works of these great personalities are preserved in the college Heritage Corner and in the Hem Barua Library.

Report:

A brief note on Asom Sahitya Sabha

Asom Sahitya Sabha is the oldest literary- cultural organization of Assam. It was founded in December, 1917. The main objective of this organization is to promote the language, culture and literature of Assam. The organization was evolved from two earlier Kolkata- based bodies- 'Asamiya Bhasa Unnati Sadhini Sabha' and 'Assamese Literary Society', established by the Assamese Students. The first Conference of the Asom Sahitya Sabha was held at Sivasagar in 1917. Exponent of Assamese literature Padmanath Gohain Baruah was the first president of the inaugural conference. At present, the conference of the Asom Sahitya Sabha is held biennially. With its central office in Jorhat, there are nine other regional offices of Asom Sahitya Sabha in different places of Assam including Guwahati. For the development of language, literature and culture of Assam, Asom Sahitya Sabha has undertaken various initiatives including publication of Dictionaries, Grammar, translation of various classics, modern contemporary fictions, analytical books, and books of science, philosophy, research works, monographs on languages, literature and culture of tribes and races.

Dr. Bhupen Hazarika:

Dr. Bhupen Hazarika was a poet, singer, music composer, actor, journalist, author and reputed film maker of Assam. Widely known as Sudha kantha, he was born on 8 September, 1926 in Tinsukia district, Assam. He was greatly influenced by Paul Robeson and composed a song named '*Bistirno parore*' which was based on the imagery and theme of Robeson's 'Ol Man River'. Later, he made several award-winning films like '*Shakuntala Sur*', '*Pratidhwani*'. Some of his directorial ventures include '*Lati-Ghati*', '*Chik Mik Bijuli*', 'For Whom the Sun Shines' and '*Mera Dharam Meri Maa*'. He had composed songs and music for many Assamese and Bangla movies including 'Aarop', 'Chameli Memsaab' and 'Shimana Perye'. He was a prominent playback singer and lent his voice to various movies like '*Era Bator Sur*', '*Shakuntala Sur*' etc. Some of his immortal contributions to Hindi cinema as a music director was in films like 'Aarop', 'Ek Pal' and 'Rudaali'.

In 1993, he won the 'Best Music Director National Award' for the movie 'Rudaali'. In 1976, he received the National Award for Best Music Director for Chameli Memsaab. He is a recipient of Sangeet Natak Akademi Award, Padmashri, Padma Bhushan, Dada Saheb Phalke

Award among others. He was honoured with Assam's highest civilian award Asom Ratna in 2009. He was posthumously awarded the Padma Vibhushan in 2012 and Bharat Ratna in 2019. He was also a member of the Assam Legislative Assembly. He passed away on 5 November 2011. He beautifully showcased the region's rich folk culture through his songs and compositions which also reflect human emotions and promote humanity and universal brotherhood. He lives on through his works.

The college is committed to preserve the memory of this great man through many initiatives.

Jogesh Das was a writer, a dedicated teacher, and a respectable journalist and novelist from Assam. He was born in 1927. In 1980, he received the prestigious Sahitya Akademi Award for his collection of short stories *Prithivir oxukh*. In 1994, Das received the Assam Valley Literary Award for his contribution to Assamese literature. He was also associated with many cultural organizations including the Asam Sahitya Sabha. He was an outstanding writer of the *Ramdhenu* era. He is well known for his short stories and novels. Through his stories he portrays essential truth of life with sympathy and understanding. He had a unique quality of expressing his thoughts in a simple style, who also emerged as a fiction writer in the early fifties. His first novel is *Kolpotuwar Mrityu*, followed by *Daawor aru nai* published in 1955 established him as an influential novelist. His other collections include *Jonakir Jui* (Flame of the Fire fly (1959), *Nirupai-Nirupai*(1963), *Emuthi Dhuli* (1965), *Haazaar Phul* (1967), *Nedekha Juir Dhowa*(1972), *Obidha*(1972) and *Naresh Maloti Aru* (1977). His Story books are *Popiya Tora* (1956), *Andharor Are Are*(1958), *Triveni* (1961), *Modaror Bedona* (1963)and *Haazaar Lokor Bhir* (1965).His *Kalpatuar mrittu* is a psychological case study of a lower middle class family. *Dawar Aru Nai* (There is no more cloud) a famous book authored by him was set against the background of the World War II, and its effects on the life of the tea gardenpeople. He has enriched Assamese literature with his outstanding contributions.

Dr. Nirmal Prabha Bordoloi was a poet, lyricist and writer associated with Assamese Literature. She has contributed a lot towards the development of Assamese literature. She has faced several hurdles in the course of becoming a renowned name in the field of Assamese literature. Her poems are marked by emotional crisis and protest against social ills. She wrote more than 54 Assamese and English books, along with innumerable Assamese songs. She also wrote several Children's fiction and books on Assamese folk culture. She was president of the Asam Sahitya Sabha in 1991 and also received several awards including the SahityaAkademi Award in 1983 for her book of poems *Sudirgho Din Aru Ritu*, the President's Award in 1957 for children's literature and the Asam Sahitya Sabha award twice in 1977 and 1989 forher non-fiction books '*Dinar Pisat Din*' and '*Debi*', respectively. She was conferred with the

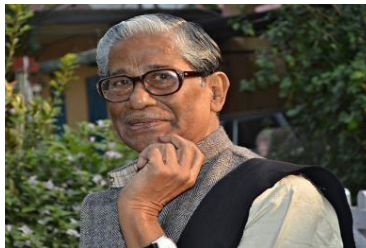

Padmashri Dr. Birendra Nath Dutta is an Indian academician, a linguist, a researcher of Folklore, a singer, and a lyricist of Assam. In his career he mainly worked as a professor in different colleges of Assam. In 1957, he started his career as a lecturer of B.Borooah College. In 1964 he joined as principal in Pramathesh Baruah College at Gauripur. In 1979 he joined Gauhati University as a Reader and went on to become the Head of the Department of Folklore. He retired from Gauhati University in 1995. After that he joined Tezpur University as a professor in the Department of Traditional Culture and Art forms.

Dutta wrote a number of scholarly books. One of his books, Cultural Contours of North East India was published by Oxford University Press. He was honoured with Padma Shri in the year 2009 for his outstanding contributions in the field of Literature and Education. He is a recipient of Jagaddhatri-Harmohan Das Literary award for the year 2010. He received the award for his book *SankarMadhavar Manisha Aru Asomar Sanaskritic Utaradhikar*. He served as the president of Asom Sahitya Sabha for two sessions.
